### **AXHOLME SOUTH**

#### **Priority One = West Street and Parklands, West Butterwick – Anti-social behaviour and criminal damage.**

There have been incidents of criminal damage caused to motor vehicles in the West Street area of West Butterwick. Also reports of theft from the Parklands area, where a hot-tub was stolen from a garden. No specific times have been identified for these crimes, however information gathering are on-going. With the lighter evenings approaching reports of off road motor bikes are also beginning to be brought to the attention of Neighbourhood staff with bikes on the field at the hall, these incidents although sporadic at this time with no particular times of when it occurs, however police and staff will deal with any offenders and bikes will be seized.

The Neighbourhood team together with incident response staff are making regular patrols of the area and will deal with any offences and offenders committing crime. **Vehicle Fail to Stop** = A male was arrested over the weekend after failing to stop for police in Graizeland. The male also had his vehicle seized as it was not insured.

**Breach of Bail** = A male was arrested for breaching his bail conditions and detained for court.

**Male Arrested for Theft** = After police enquiries revealed the whereabouts of a stolen pedal cycle a male has been arrested for theft.
