

HAXEY PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes from the meeting held on Tuesday 20th October, 2015 at 6.30pm at The Foreman Carter Centre, Westwoodside Playing Field, Westwoodside.

Present: Cllrs Allcock, Booth, Carlile, Cooke, Fiddler, Foreman, Harris, Knowles, Lange, Lindley, Morris, Orton, Smedley & Whitehead.

Also Present: Deb Hotson – Parish Clerk, NLC David Rose & Sally Walker, Andrew McLeod – Frack Free Isle representative & 7 residents.

Chairman: Cllr Knowles presided.

Public Participation

NLC Sally Walker informed the Council of the duties of the new Community Wardens. There are no longer Traffic Wardens these have been replaced by the Community Wardens.

Prior to 2010 the police enforced on street parking restrictions (yellow lines etc) and NLC the off street car parks. In 2010 they gained ‘civil enforcement powers’ from the DFT whereby they took over on street enforcement from the police, when it then became a ‘civil’ offence rather than a ‘criminal’ offence. Previous NLC car park wardens became ‘civil enforcement officers’.

In 2015 the decision was made to extend the role of parking team to include enforcement of such things as litter, dog fouling, fly tipping, abandoned vehicles etc.

The parking team now consists of some ‘Community Wardens’ who carry out the wider enforcement role, as well as parking, and some ‘civil enforcement officers’ who just carry out parking enforcement.

The role of the Community Wardens is one of education and enforcement (can issue FPN’s for £80 (discounted to £50 if paid within 10 days).

As well as providing a visible presence to deter offences, the Community Wardens respond to intelligence received from members and the general public in relation to litter, dog fouling etc.

This intelligence, obtained via the council’s self-service portal, is invaluable in directing what are limited resources to the right place at the right time.

The best intelligence includes details of day(s) of the week, times, exact locations, descriptions of persons/animals, known names/addresses etc.

To report intelligence you need to go onto the ‘Self Service Portal’ on the NLC website and register. This then allows you to either ‘Report Parking Problem’ or ‘Report Neighbourhood Problem’ (dog fouling, littering), giving as much detail as possible.

Cllr Knowles asked if NLC had the powers to spot fine anyone parking on the footpaths to which Sally Walker stated the enforcement can only take place if on double yellow lines.

Ms Walker asked that all issues were reported via the self-service portal or by using 01724 297000.

Ms Walker stated that the job was new and would evolve and she would be quite happy to come back again to provide an update on the Community Wardens.

If Cllrs do not know or have access to the portal the Clerk will log an issue but will require full details and locations to do so.

Sally Walker left the meeting at 6.50pm.

Cllr Knowles stated that he had just collected registered post which was documentation from Telsa with regard to a Seismic Survey. The Clerk had requested soft copies of the documentation and will circulate when received.

Mr McLeod introduced himself and the following is from a report provided to the Council.

Egdon Resources UK Ltd is an onshore oil & gas exploration and production business whose interests include non-conventional hydrocarbons such as shale gas. They are the operator of licence block PL162 which includes the southern half of the Isle, and also licence block PEDL209 which is immediately to the south of PL162 and includes a small portion of the Isle between Owston Ferry and West Stockwith. Egdon already have planning and Environment Agency permits to drill an exploratory well at Laughton, and in a letter to Gainsborough Parish Council in February 2014 they gave a strong hint that they may apply to drill a shale gas well in the west of PEDL209, which would put them in or very near the Isle.

Egdon have contracted Tesla Exploration International Ltd to carry out a two-dimensional seismic survey covering an area which includes Graizelound, Haxey, Eastlound, Westwoodside, Epworth and parts of Wroot, Belton and Sandtoft, to map the deep geological structure and its potential oil & gas bearing prospect. This would include the Bowland Shale which requires high-volume hydraulic fracturing, commonly known as fracking, to extract its gas.

This seismic survey is expected to commence during the next 3 months and take 28 days to complete, and is a permitted development under Schedule 2 Part 17 Class K of the Town & Country Planning (General Permitted Development) Order 2015. This order requires the developer to notify North Lincolnshire Council prior to commencement. I have asked NLC if they have received any such notification from Tesla but have not yet received a satisfactory response.

The survey involves detonating explosive charges placed in 8 metre deep boreholes spaced 50 metres apart along the survey lines, and detecting the signals reflected off the underlying rock layers using receiver nodes placed at 12.5 metre intervals along the survey lines.

There is a grid of six individual survey lines each positioned within a 400 metre wide corridor, and the combined total length of these lines is approximately 50 kilometres.

Frack Free Isle has a number of concerns about this survey.

1. This is a foot in the door for the fracking industry. If this survey reveals recoverable reserves of shale gas, it is likely that Egdon would want to exploit this, which would bring fracking to the Isle. I do not have time on this occasion to detail the many compelling reasons why we oppose fracking, but I have brought an information pack for each Councillor outlining the main issues, and we would be grateful if you would give these your consideration and visit our website where there is more detailed information.
2. We believe that Tesla should have notified all of the affected town and parish councils of their plans months ago, to give them time to study and comment upon them, but this does not appear to have happened.
3. We believe that Tesla should have held public meetings to inform residents about this and hear why some of us do not want this activity in our communities.
4. We know of a number of owners of land within the survey corridors who have not been asked for permission to enter their land.
5. When Tesla conducted a similar survey at Misson, they just arrived and got started without any warning or consultation with residents or the Parish Council. Residents were intimidated by Tesla's security guards who were watching people as they walked in the survey area. At least one resident who had not given consent found a receiver node in their garden, and residents were alarmed at the strength of the explosions, which shook some of the houses.

We respectfully request that Haxey Parish Council contact Tesla as soon as possible and demand that they do the following:

1. Immediately send this council full details of their plans, including a detailed map which the council are free to copy and put in the public domain for examination by residents and landowners.
2. Immediately put this survey on hold until they have properly and fully consulted with the affected parish and town councils, landowners and residents and given them reasonable time to make a considered response.
3. Obtain informed, written consent from the owners of all the land they intend to enter, with no exceptions, satisfy the town and parish councils that they have done so, and scrupulously respect the wishes of all landowners who deny them consent.

In summary, this is a taste of the behaviour that we can expect from the oil and gas industry unless we come together to keep them out of our countryside and our communities. They don't care about us, or about the well-being of our children and grandchildren. They are concerned only with maximising their profits, their executives' pay and their share value. If we want to keep the Isle frack-free, we should take this opportunity to send a clear message to Tesla and Egdon that they are not welcome here.

Cllr Knowles stated that under GPDO Tesla were able to enter the land but had to have the land owners consent. From past experience NLC are there to ensure that the process is carried out correctly and that the questions asked by the group are valid and the item would be discussed under agenda item 1510/26. The letter and documents received were in balance but from past experience Tesla are reluctant to get into a debate. Clerk to contact NLC to see if they have a copy of the documentation.

1 resident left the meeting.

Cllr Knowles opened the meeting.

Cllr Harris stated that the caravan at East Lound was still in situ to which Cllr Allcock stated that the applicant had appealed which was a 6 month process. Clerk to add this to the outstanding list.

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1510/15 Clerks Report

- a. Haxey Post Office – The Post Office in Haxey has now closed and has not re-opened within Greenhill Stores as stated on 09/10. Clerk circulated the response received from the Post Office when contacted as detailed below:-

Regrettably, due to unforeseen circumstances, the proposed relocation of the Post Office to Greenhill Stores was not able to go ahead as planned on 9 October 2015.

We are aware that unfortunately this does leave Haxey without a Post Office service and are working hard to restore this as soon as possible.

In the meantime customers requiring Post Office facilities may use any convenient Post Office branch. Two suggested alternatives are:

1. *Westwoodside Post Office, Brethergate, Westwoodside, DN9 2AU
Opening hours: Mon-Fri 9am-12noon/1pm-17.30pm. Sat 9-12.30pm*
2. *Owston Ferry Post Office, 8-9 Market Place, Owston Ferry, DN9 1RB
Opening hours: Mon-Tues 9am – 12.30pm/1.30pm -5.30pm. Fri - Sat 9am-12.30pm*

We will of course inform you as soon as we receive a date for the restoration of services.

We apologise for any inconvenience this may cause and thank you for your continued patience during this time.

Clerk to write to the Post Office stating the parish is disappointed and that this is causing problems particularly to the elderly. The Parish Council would like to be informed of the exact reasons for the delay in opening. Clerk to copy in Cllr Liz Redfern and Andrew Percy MP as well as the Ward Cllrs.

Cllr Rose through the Chair stated that NLC had also contacted the Post Office asking when the service will be available in Greenhill Stores and to firm up the dates for when the Westwoodside Post Office would be located in Nisa.

NLC had also contacted the Co-operative to see if they would change their mind with regard to locating the Post Office within the Haxey store.

FP100 – Clerk to write to Mr Alan Pearson who has recently cleared some of FP100 as he had slipped on it to thank him for his work.

- b. ERNLLCA September newsletter.
- c. Brethergate overgrown hedge report – this has now been cut back.
- d. The Axholme Bridleway Association along with NLC has started to cut back the Greenway. Work commenced by doing a short section near to Haxey School. This was a taster session to see what tools are required. Dates will be set for future work.
- e. NLC Licensing Sub-Committee to discuss Stanholme Guest House has been rescheduled for 26/10. Cllr Allcock to represent the Parish Council.
- f. Copy of email sent from a resident to NLC Dave Sanderson thanking for the work carried out on FP101. The resident also thanked Cllr Allcock and the Parish Council for their support on getting the footpath repaired.
- g. Email received from NLC Dave Sanderson informing the Council that he has looked at BR75 which does not have gates but drop bollards in place. He states that in his opinion they are not causing an obstruction to foot or horse users. FP113 will only be maintained as a bridleway and to that end it is in good enough repair to meet those standards. The surface of FP100 is satisfactory but NLC are to seek quotes to have the section stoned that is not currently done.
- h. NLC Planning for Health & Wellbeing and Planning for Solar Photovoltaic Development consultations – Cllrs to complete if they would like to do so.

- i. Email from the owner of 34 Doncaster Road with regard to the Parish Councils recent comments to the planning applications submitted. Comments noted.

- k. Central Lincolnshire Consultation Event – Cllr Knowles to review on behalf of the Council.

Improvement / Projects

- 1510/16** To receive an update on the Isle of Axholme Hatfield Chase projects determining if any further actions are required.

Cllr Knowles informed the Council that on 27/10 documents will be collect by the Digitising Company who will work with these in the first instance. Cllr Morris has contacted the Westwoodside Townsman who will be providing the latest mere book and maps for digitising.

- 1510/17** To receive an update from the Local Awards Working Group determining next actions required.

The draft form was circulated and amended as per comments received. This will be placed into the next edition of the Arrow and copies provided round the parish at various locations.

Clerk to look into Freepost for their return and place this information into the next Arrow.

Cllr Booth stated that she had been disappointed in gaining access to the winning template and had had to go to the school after trying several times to obtain the information. Cllr Orton stated that he would get access and send to Cllr Fiddler. Cllr Fiddler stated that he would need the original picture with no added writing.

Highways / Neighbourhood Services / North Lincolnshire Council items

- 1510/18** To consider the purchase of dog bag dispensers determining actions required.

The Clerk provided details of both the dispenser and the cost of the bags. It was agreed not to go ahead and purchase any at this point. **Proposed: Cllr Whitehead, seconded: Cllr Booth – 10 for, 3 against with 1 abstention.**

- 1510/19** To determine actions required with regard to a disabled bay outside the Doctors Surgery on Church Street, Haxey.

Comments received from both the Surgery and NLC were circulated.

Cllr Allcock asked that the item be deferred for a decision until himself and Cllr Rose had their group Conservative meeting as this was an item not only for Haxey but a proposal for a policy for the whole of North Lincolnshire for a disabled bay outside Doctors surgeries and pharmacies, where possible, that would be presented at the next meeting.

Cllr Carlile declared a personal interest.

- 1510/20** To be notified of the NLC Neighbourhood Cinema Touring Fund determining any actions required.

The Clerk informed the meeting that due to time constraints she had registered an interest in the fund and would await further information from NLC.

- 1510/21** To be notified of the ERNLLCA consultation questionnaire determining actions required.

Resolved – form completed by Cllr Knowles was circulated prior to the meeting was approved. **Proposed: Cllr Harris, seconded: Cllr Booth. All in favour.** Clerk to submit to ERNLLCA.

- 1510/22** To determine actions required with regard to the winter requirements for salt from NLC.

The Clerk informed the meeting that the only option available was to have 2 tonnes delivered for Councils to fill the green bins independently. At the T & PC meeting the Clerk had raised this as an issue due to the amount of salt wasted in previous years and the lack of space to store the salt at all her Councils. Cllr Allcock had also been in touch with Highways with regard to this concern and as a result NLC will now offer an option of receiving 2 tonnes or have the green bins filled. The Clerk had informed NLC that Haxey Parish Council would like their green bins filled.

Reports / Updates

- 1510/23** To receive a report from the Ward Councillor on activities within North Lincolnshire Council.

Cllr Allcock informed the Council that he had attended the Licensing Sub Committee on 08/10 with regard to the Stanholme Guest House and due to 3 of the objectors being unable to attend the meeting had been adjourned until 26/10. Cllr Allcock will be representing the Parish Council.

Cllr Allcock stated he and Cllr Rose had received a detailed highway plan for Haxey School parking along the piece of land adjacent to the Nooking. A meeting to take this forward has been arranged for November 4th. The Parish Council will be kept informed.

Cllr Lindley stated that in her capacity as a School Governor at Haxey School she would like to pass on many thanks for the work carried out by Cllr Allcock.

1510/24 To receive a report from the Westwoodside Playing Field Management Committee.

The Clerk informed the meeting that Espirit Football Academy was now at the Centre on a daily basis.

The Clerk has also been in touch with Northern Powergrid with regard to the power surges and light issues. Northern Powergrid have identified that there is a fault but to date have been unable to find the fault. Clerk has been chasing this on a weekly basis and will contact again this week. (During the meeting whilst the MUGA was in use the lights were dipping in and out). **Post meeting:** the Clerk has been in contact with Northern Powergrid again and a fault has been identified as a transformer. Due to the access required to repair this there will have to be programmed power shut down and permits have to be sought therefore it could take between 4-6 weeks to repair and possibly longer.

Cllr Harris informed the meeting that unfortunately HPFA Machine Store had been broken into and had had the mowers stolen. The Insurance Company were dealing with the theft but it was agreed that this was a major setback for a group striving hard to keep the facilities going.

1510/25 To receive a report from the NLC Town & Parish Council Liaison meeting and the ERNLLCA District meeting determining any actions required.

Cllr Knowles informed the meeting that he had attended the ERNLLCA District Meeting that saw 9 people attending.

The questionnaire was discussed along with NLC responsibilities for structures include bridges and for example Greenhill. Tree Preservation Orders (TPO's) were discussed.

Cllr Knowles also attend the T & PC meeting which Cllr Allcock chaired.

A presentation on the Winter Service was provided along with a presentation on Ward Network Officers.

An offer was also provided for the Ward Officers to attend Parish Council meeting if required.

Cllr Allcock added that the staff that was previously employed for gritting on a standby basis are now employed full time to work through the night and when gritting was not being undertaken they would work on other issues like maintenance of street lighting.

1510/26 To receive a report from the Fracking meeting determining any actions required.

Cllr Fiddler informed the Council that he had attended a recent meeting on Fracking which seemed to be based on the negative issues on the subject but Cllr Fiddler stated that if all regulations are in place the process should run smoothly. Fracking was the last process after drilling.

Cllr Carlile added that the report provided by Mr McLeod made some good valid points. GPDO's was the initial route being made to avoid having to put in planning which allowed detonation of areas and to carry out surveys.

Cllr Carlile stated that GDPO's did not give authority to access land this was the decision of the land owners.

Cllr Fiddler informed the Council that this was not the first seismic survey in the area or indeed the UK and stated that Misson were fighting against the drilling of 12 bore holes which had been instigated by IGas who have recently submitted a Scoping Report and were collating the response back from consultation. These bore holes would allow water samples to be taken and monitored and if there was a change then drilling would cease.

Cllr Knowles stated that Councillors need to think about the creation of a policy on the subject with reference to Parish land and that this would need to be discussed, agreed at the November meeting and that Parish land Tenants would then need to be informed. It was agreed to write to Telsa and ask if they would attend a meeting to discuss the survey.

1510/27 To receive an update on the Remembrance Service preparations including the approval of a donation for the poppy wreaths of £100 and refreshments of £75 to the PCC.

Resolved – a sum not to exceed £250 to cover the cost of the wreath and PCC donations, transport for Westwoodside School children and donation to South Axholme Academy for the buglers.
