

HAXEY PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes from the meeting held on Tuesday 26th January, 2016 at 7pm at The Foreman Carter Centre, Westwoodside Playing Field, Westwoodside.

Present: Cllrs Allcock, Boor, Booth, Carlile, Fiddler, Harris, Knowles, Lange, Lindley, Smedley & Whitehead.

Also Present: Deb Hotson – Parish Clerk & 5 residents.

Chairman: Cllr Knowles presided.

Public Participation

Cllr Knowles noted that the lights in the centre were all working well after the work carried out by the electricity board to replace their broken transformer.

Cllr Knowles thanked Cllr Fiddler for the framed Hood picture now mounted on the wall in the Meeting Room. Mrs Everatt asked if the Parish Council had heard anything with regard to the Absolute Children's Home at Low Burnham to which Cllr Knowles stated that they had not. Cllr Allcock informed Mrs Everatt and the Council that he had a couple of meetings arranged at the beginning of February with Planning and would enquire at these meetings.

Mr McLeod stated that Frack Free Isle recently made the following offer to the Parish Council.

“Frack Free Isle would like to assist Haxey Parish Council to conduct a survey of residents to find out if they are for or against fracking in the Isle. We can offer a contribution to the cost of printing an information leaflet and questionnaire, and assistance with the delivery of leaflets and analysis of the returns. We also have within our organising group graphic design expertise if the council would like assistance with leaflet design. We would like an input into the wording of the information presented and the questions asked, but would of course expect this to include a balanced, evidence-based representation of both the pro- and anti-fracking viewpoints, and we would accept that Haxey Parish Council would make the final decision as to what was on the leaflet.

The council's response was to respectfully decline our offer, on the grounds that:

The Parish Council and Councillors are required to maintain their total independence on certain matters and not exhibit any pre-determination position which could lead to the development of a prejudicial interest in a particular issue. Any pre-determination could preclude councillors from being able to vote, particularly if any future issues are likely to be associated with planning applications, which will come before the Council for resolution.

This came as something of a surprise, since we are aware that a neighbouring Parish Council had carried out a parish survey in co-operation with their local anti-fracking group, along the lines we have suggested. I contacted a member of that council to confirm that our understanding was correct, and she seems to disagree that the pre-determination issue precludes co-operation. She says:

The Action Group and the Parish Council worked together to produce the survey and petition. Parish Councillors were part of the door knocking team and found it was an excellent way to engage with their community, raise awareness and canvas opinion.

The pre-determination statement applies to planning committees at District and County level as they are required to make a decision on planning applications; Parish Councils are a consultee and are invited to respond. They can object to or support an application. It requires them therefore to form a judgement which should be based on sound reasoning and that means taking into account the views of their community on such a major type of development in a rural area.

Frack Free Isle can of course carry out our own survey, but it would be a major undertaking and we would want to be sure that all parties could have confidence in the results. Our concern is that whilst we would do our best to present the arguments in a non-prejudicial way, the mere fact that our position on fracking is clearly not neutral would lead some of those we seek to inform to reject the results out-of-hand however careful we were. This is why we would very much prefer to work together with the council on this, and we respectfully request that you give this matter further consideration with a view to finding a mutually acceptable way forward”.

Cllr Knowles stated that the email had been received over the Christmas period and the Clerk had forwarded to ERNLLCA for advice which had subsequently been passed onto Mr McLeod and detailed in his statement above. Clerk to circulate the ERNLLCA information and to place onto the agenda for the next meeting.
Cllr Knowles opened the meeting.

- 1601/06** **Planning**
- a. To receive and decisions received and to discuss the following application received from NLC.
The following decisions were received from NLC.
2014/0415 – full planning permission granted to erect a detached four bedroom dormer dwelling and a detached single domestic garage at land to side of 9 Holm Road, Westwoodside.
2015/1139 – Mr Sowerby, 32 Low Street - planning permission to erect five dwellings with associated hard and soft landscaping. This was considered at the Planning Committee meeting held on 13/01/16.
Cllr Allcock provided the Council with an update from the Planning Committee with regard to the decision of this application. At the meeting Cllr Allcock recorded that he would be voting against this application and the site was outside the development boundary and concerns about highway safety. However planning permission was granted by the Planning Committee. The previous application on this site had been refused by NLC. An appeal was dismissed by the Planning Inspector, but he indicated that the development site was acceptable in principle and highway safety issues were the problem. This application was for fewer houses and it was considered that the highway issues had now been addressed.
MIN/2015/1169 – planning permission to remove condition 5 of MIN/2013/0988 at Cove Farm Quarry, Cove Road has now been withdrawn.
2015/1279 – refusal of planning permission to erect a detached dormer bungalow at land south of The Mount, Lowcroft Avenue, Haxey.
2015/1386 – full planning permission granted to erect extension to side at 15 The Meadows, Westwoodside.
2015/1394 – full planning permission granted to erect entrance gates and brick pillars at Lilac Cottage, Uppertorpe Road, Westwoodside.
2015/1492 – full planning permission granted to erect a part two storey, part single storey extension (to include the demolition of existing extensions) at Willow Cottage, Turbary Road, Haxey.

The following applications were discussed by the Parish Council

2015/1446 – Mr Fretwell, Monkham Bridge Farm, 101 Doncaster Road, Westwoodside – planning permission to erect a cold store.

Resolved – No objection, suggest a hedge is planted to screen from the road and ask why a flooding plan has not been requested as in flood area.

Proposed: Cllr Carlile, seconded: Cllr Booth. 10 for with 1 abstention.

2015/1540 – Mr & Mrs McCallum, South View, 43 Brethergate, Westwoodside – planning permission to erect a single storey front extension and two-storey side and rear extension.

Resolved – No objection or comments.

Proposed: Cllr Carlile, seconded: Cllr Boor. 10 for with 1 abstention.

2015/1544 – Ms Smith, The Willows, 9 Nethergate, Westwoodside – planning permission to raise ridge height to facilitate roof conversion.

Resolved – No objection, inform NLC that there are more buildings on the site than suggested on the documentation submitted and that this results in a potential overdevelopment of the site. Concerns too with regard to how it fits in with the street scene.

Proposed: Cllr Booth, seconded: Cllr Carlile. 10 for with 1 abstention.

2015/1569 – Mr & Mrs Farrell, 19 Ash Tree Drive, Haxey – planning permission for front bay extension and associated internal alterations, attached garage and alterations to access.

Resolved – Object with concerns on how the garage will be accessed and the proposal will result in an overdevelopment of the site.

Proposed: Cllr Carlile, seconded: Cllr Booth. 6 for, 4 against with 1 abstention.

2015/1584 – Mr & Mrs Neath, Melwood, 109 Akeferry Road, Westwoodside – planning permission to erect a single storey rear and side extension, extend existing garage to form two open fronted car parts and erect new boundary timber post and rail fencing.

Resolved – No objection, comment asking if planning permission was required for the dormer windows which are detailed in the application and inform NLC that the area has issues with regard to poorly draining land.

Proposed: Cllr Carlile, seconded: Cllr Booth. 9 for, 1 against with 1 abstention.

2015/1590 – Mr Embleton, Stanholme Guest House, 27 Low Street, Haxey – planning permission to vary condition 3 of PA/2014/0419 to allow for pop-up tapas and pop-up restaurant.

The resolution not to object with comments was not supported and no amendment was put forward. Therefore the previous resolution passed by the Council remains extant.

b. To receive an update on outstanding planning concerns, determining further actions required.

Cllr Allcock updated the Council stating that NLC Enforcement Officer has visited Clampit Creek and it was suggested that the log cabins were not being lived in but one of the caravans had been moved and was being lived in. NLC Legal Department are to deal with this.

Walkabout Farm – a site visit found lots of vehicles on site. The owner was not on site on the visit so a further visit was to be undertaken. It was also noted that a large area had been excavated. It was believed that breaches are in place and NLC will be following this up.

Cllr Allcock as stated earlier will be attending a couple of meetings early in February with the Planning Department and the Chair of the Planning Committee to discuss outstanding issues.

Langholme Farm – NLC advice they are waiting for further information from the applicant with regard to more substantial buildings.

Low Burnham Garage is still being monitored.

Cllr Harris suggested that Article 4 type regulation could apply to Clampit Creek and asked if Cllr Allcock could raise this at his meeting with NLC Planners.

1601/07 Clerks Report

- a. A plan has been received from NLC with regard to the proposed disabled parking bay outside the Doctors Surgery in Haxey. **Resolved** – support the plan in principle as set out and this would be formally resolved at

the next meeting. This was due to time constraints and in order to start the process. **Proposed: Cllr Booth, seconded: Cllr Whitehead. All in favour.**

Improvement / Projects

1601/08 To receive an update on the Isle of Axholme Hatfield Chase projects including the approval of the Historical Group TOR and determine if any further actions are required.

Resolved – TOR approved. **Proposed: Cllr Lindley, seconded: Cllr Allcock. All in favour.**

Cllr Knowles updated the Council on the projects – a meeting with NLC was to be arranged to discuss the projects. NLC have confirmed that they are responsible for Greenhill which will include repairs to the wall. The Parish Council will work with NLC and may possibly have to fund the electrics to up light the cross of piety.

NLC Tim Allen had found and passed to Cllr Allcock a contract from 1899 which showed that the Greenhill in its present form was built for just over £13, a third of which was paid for by the Parish Council and two thirds being paid by Gainsborough Council.

The Pinfolds and Meres will be looked at with regard to marking and renovating.

The Clerk is in the process of obtaining quotes to repaint the war memorial railings and grant funding to be sought.

The sundial in the closed churchyard is owned by the Church but maintained by the Parish Council. The Clerk to put onto the insurance policy.

1601/09 To receive the recommendations from the Parish Path Group determining actions required.

Cllr Smedley went through the notes circulated prior to the meeting.

The purpose of the meeting was to finalise discussion of the proposal that the Parish Council take over the maintenance of the footpaths and bridleways within the Haxey Parish, and to decide on a recommendation to the Full Council.

Clerk to confirm the following:-

- Local contractor's rates.
- Amount of paths and bridleways.
- HPC would require long term commitment to any agreement.
- A simplified form of tender to be used.
- Tim Allen has verbally confirmed costs that will be covered by NLC are:-
 - Grass cutting at a set fee per meter.
 - New footpaths leaflet.
 - Signage.
 - Cutting back hedges.
 - Clearing fallen trees.
 - Replacement of bridges over ditches.
 - Surface improvements.
 - Parish Clerk admin.

- Insurance.

The benefits would be closer control, ability to make improvements, and speedier resolution of any problems.

The disadvantages would be more work for the Parish Clerk (although this could be reimbursed) and greater involvement by Parish Councillors.

The Working Party has fully discussed all the issues and RECOMMEND to the Parish Council that it take over the management of the footpaths and bridleways within the Parish from 1st April 2016, with the following conditions to be confirmed in writing:-

- Verify lengths of footpaths and bridleways to be maintained.
- Verify that actual quoted costs by any Contractors tendering for the work are not more than 10p and 5p.
- Confirm all additional costs would be paid by NLC.
- Confirm that it is long term Agreement, but that it may be renegotiated at any time in the future.

Resolved – accept Parish Plan Group recommendations in principle – all outstanding issues to be sorted and reported back to the Council before any formal contract is entered into. **Proposed: Cllr Lindley, seconded: Cllr Boor. All in favour.**

1601/10 To consider the celebrations for the Queens 90th Birthday in June 2016.

Cllr Smedley to investigate the lighting of a beacon on 21st April – Clerk to register on the official site.

Resolved – Clerk to apply for funding which is available to go towards costs. Cllr Booth to look into the costs of commemorative mugs for the school children. Street Party to also be looked into.

Cllr Smedley informed the Council that the Isle of Axholme Lions Group would be participating in a litter pick on the 4th and 5th of March as part of the Clean for Queen Campaign.

1601/11 To receive an update from the Planting Group determining actions required.

Cllr Smedley updated the Council on the notes circulated prior to the meeting.

- 1601/15** To receive a report from the Ward Councillor on activities within North Lincolnshire Council.
Cllr Allcock stated that he had been concentrating over the past few weeks on getting funding towards flood defence schemes and the maintenance of dykes and drains.
On the issue of Local Levy the Trent Regional Flood and Coastal Committee (RFCC) has agreed a 2% increase. Locally the Isle of Axholme Water Level management Board which carries out flood prevention works at maintains water courses and pumping stations in our area as also agreed a 2% increase in funding.
Low Burnham's camera has had to be located to another area.
A complaint was received with regard to the state of a few road signs which have been ordered by NLC for Station Road, Haxey Lane and Akeferry Road have been cleaned.
Both Haxey & Westwoodside Post Offices opens at their new location on 27/01.
The purchase of land at Haxey School is now with DDM who are valuing the land.
- 1601/16** To receive a report from the Westwoodside Playing Field Management Committee.
The Pride of the Isle Charity Event was held at the weekend raising just under £15.5k. 400 people attended in the marquee and the event was a success.
The Pride Committee has created a path from Holme Lane which assisted guests in entering the marquee. The main access from Akeferry Road has been resurfaced and the children's play area sand will be sorted in due course.
- 1601/17** To receive a report for Haxey Playing Field Association.
Cllr Harris stated that there was a quiz night planed for the 1st Saturday in March.
Security was to be taken forward.
- 1601/18** To receive a report on the website update determining any further actions required.
The Clerk thanked those Cllrs who had provided updates for the website which had all been submitted to Kyanite and once these have been added the website will go live.
- 1601/19** To receive an update report on hydro-carbon activities in the area.
Cllr Fiddler updated the Council stating that the application submitted to Nottingham County Council 3 months ago had been approved but with 6 pages of conditions. This will allow 12 exploratory holes for testing the water and this is to be completed by the end of March. To date no contractor had been chosen. The application will see the monitoring of the water quality, quantity and flow. Cllr Fiddler stated that it had taken 2 years to get this far with this application. There had been a complaint to Finningley Council with regard to the route. It has been confirmed the preferred route will not see the HGV's coming through Wroot or Haxey. Cllr Allcock added that NLC had submitted comments with regard to this application on the route that traffic would take and the height of the drilling rig.
- 1601/20** To receive a report on the Allotment AGM determining any actions required.
The minutes for the AGM were circulated prior to the meeting.
Cllrs Knowles and Whitehead attended the meeting. All the plots are taken. The allotments have been running for 7 years and have now got electric power on the site, the toilet block and a communal building. Over the 7 years there hasn't been a tight regime over the rubbish and subsequently there is now a build-up, this including vegetation, plastic and wood. The Allotment Association ask the Parish Council if they could fund the hire of an 8 tonne skip to remove this debris. The Clerk has looked at costs and a skip can be hired for £150.

Resolved – hire the skip for the allotments but reiterate that this is a one off and they have to take responsibility for the rubbish in the future.
