

## HAXEY PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes from the meeting held on Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> March, 2019 at 7pm at The Foreman Carter Centre, Westwoodside Playing Field, Westwoodside.

**Present:** Cllrs Allcock, Booth, Carlile, Condliff, Fiddler, Harris, Henwood, Hunt-Siwy, Knowles & Whitehead.

**Also Present:** Deb Hotson – Parish Clerk & 7 residents.

**Chairman:** Cllr Knowles presided.

### Public Participation

A resident stated that she had a personal and social objection to PA/2019/392. As a neighbour to the proposed development nothing has changed since PA/2018/1294 was submitted last July. The plot size remains the same with the same density. There is an historical aspect as the neighbouring properties which are 150/200 years old. An objection has been submitted on the NLC portal.

The resident went on say that the first property's access is on a blind spot on the highway and NLC Waste Collection have stated they will not enter the access road and waste bins will be collected from the main road.

The wildlife on the current plot is prevalent with adders, hedgehogs and birds. There are currently no TPO's on the site; however, there is anecdotal evidence that trees on the site were subject to TPOs prior to the fire at Boothferry Borough Council fire which destroyed documents some years ago. Rural agricultural vehicles will need entry to get to the rear field and this is thought to prove difficult due to the width of the access road.

Cllr Knowles opened the meeting.

Cllr Allcock stated that he would not be participating in discussion on planning applications as he may be called to substitute on Planning Committee meetings. When Cllr Allcock is not a substitute at a meeting, he will be able to participate in cases and talk at meetings on behalf of the Parish Council and/or residents.

- 1903/06** **Planning**
- a. To receive any decisions from NLC and to discuss the following application received from NLC. The following decisions were received from NLC.

**2018/1292** – appeal submitted to the Secretary of State in respect of planning permission to erect a detached dwelling at land between 47 and 51 Akeferry Road, Westwoodside. Cllr Allcock declared a personal interest in the item. Clerk to resubmit the previous comments to the Planning Inspectorate.

**2018/2303** - appeal submitted to the Secretary of State in respect of planning permission to vary condition 2 (2016/777) to bring forward building line and parking spaces at The Old Chapel, Commonside, Westwoodside. Clerk to resubmit the previous comments to the Planning Inspectorate.

**2018/2403** – outline planning permission to erect two dwellings with access not reserved for subsequent approval at land to the rear of 9 Nethergate, Westwoodside will be considered by the Planning Committee on 03/04/19.

**2019/103** – planning permission to retain a children’s play den at Rose Cottage, Fields Road, East Lound will be considered by the Planning Committee on 03/04/19.

**2019/174** – planning permission to erect a two-storey gable extension, a porch extension and a single storey rear extension at 23 Akeferry Road, Westwoodside will be considered by the Planning Committee on 03/04/19.

**2019/225** – determination of the requirement for prior approval of a household extension at 4 Hallcroft Road, Haxey is not required.

**2019/266** – full planning permission granted to raise the ridge line to facilitate first floor accommodation, erection of dormer windows to the front and rear roof slopes and single storey extension to the side at 1 Park Drive, Westwoodside.

**2019/299** – application for the determination of the requirement for prior approval of a household extension at Beric, 9 Chapel Close, Westwoodside is not required. NLC response to the Parish Council confirms that a planning application is not required as the extension is on the rear of the bungalow. The principal elevation or front of the bungalow is where the front door is. This faces directly towards Chapel Close, therefore, as the extension is on the opposite side to the front door, it follows that this is the rear elevation in planning terms. The side elevations face 22 Craycroft Road and towards the property to the north, Greystones.

The following applications received from NLC were discussed by the Parish Council

**2018/2527** – advertisement consent to display 3 non-illuminated signs at Shepherds Place Farm, 99a Akeferry Road, Westwoodside.

**Resolved** – object with the following comments: -

There are currently 2 signs on the premises wall (not included in the application), 2 signs on the bridge (included in the application), 1 on the fence containing details of the premises (included in the application) and a further two blank signs (not included in the application) adjacent to the 1 on the fence.

The application is for approval of 3 signs, the two signs on the bridge are too high and block visibility when leaving the premises onto a 30-50mph highway. These two signs need better positioning.

It is suggested that the two blank signs on the fence are removed and further permission is requested for the two on the premises. There are also free-standing signs on the verge which need removing. Clerk to also inform NLC Enforcement that there are two businesses – an ice cream parlour and a tea room and it is thought there is only permission for one of these businesses.

**Proposed: Cllr Booth, seconded: Cllr Fiddler. 8 for, 1 against with 1 abstention.**

**2019/392** – planning permission to demolish existing house and erect four detached dwellings and associated garages (re-submission of 2018/1294) at 10 Commonside, Westwoodside.

**Resolved** – object with the following comments: -

We submit our previous amended comments and additional comments in relation to this application.

A pictorial of the street scene would help assist with the consultation process.

The plot has one old dwelling on it and the rest is undeveloped agricultural land and to the best of knowledge has not been used for any other purpose which would give it brownfield status. It lies within the building envelope and is subject to policies relating to rural villages of the NLC local plan and NPPF. The site access is close to the bend in the road and the increase in vehicle movement may affect the road safety due to the limited visual distance.

The housing density is not appropriate to the village of Westwoodside and will impact on the character of the rural village.

No case is made for the type of housing or an identified housing need for the type of housing has been substantiated, it is not social, or affordable housing and therefore is not an exception site in the NLC local plan CS1c CS2(3). They are large 4-bedroom houses for which no identified need in current housing stock. It is also clear the North Lincolnshire Sustainable settlement survey 2016 identifies Westwoodside as a larger rural settlement with a ranking of 18 and development is only appropriate if there is an identified need. (Sustainable settlement need survey 2016 Page 31).

The developer has offered no such evidence which supports this development

CS1c) - Rural settlements will be supported as thriving sustainable communities, with a strong focus on retaining and enhancing existing local services to meet local needs. Development will be limited and should take into account levels of local service provision, infrastructure capacity and accessibility. Any development that takes place should be in keeping with the character and nature of the settlement.

CS (3) - Small scale developments within the defined development limits of rural settlements to meet identified local needs. Sustainable settlement needs 2016 Page 30. There are 20 settlements in this group. Larger Rural Settlements provide a few essential services to the local population and any smaller adjacent settlements. Small additional development may be appropriate if there is an identified need. This may require the growth of these settlements with the possibility of new housing development. These settlements are unsuitable for substantial growth but capable of accommodating an allocation either within or adjoining the settlement.

We are particular concerned at the loss of any garden which are a key part of the character of the area and providing large open space within the parish and contend that Government policy made clear gardens are not brownfield and NPPF48 they are not windfall sites. We can find no evidence that current policy is designed to protect gardens which form a key part of the character of rural villages NPPF53 and it is our view that NLC local plan relating to windfall site is a contradiction of NPPF53 in its application relating to rural villages. NPPF53 Local planning authorities should consider the case for setting out policies to resist inappropriate development of residential gardens, for example where development would cause harm to the local area. We are concerned both NPPF and The Local Plan are being driven by pressure from central government at the expense of rural villages, as we can see no clear and convincing evidence for this development.

We fully support and endorse the comments of the Kennedy's and agree with the comments of the Brown's and in particular the observation. "This application is just a re-submission of PA/2018/1294 with the building on plot 5 not included, but reserved in its entirety for future development."

We consider the three buildings on the frontage will not enhance the street scene and therefore this application fails to address the issues in the previous application.

**2018/1294** – The site is in the village of Westwoodside and it forms part of Haxey Parish being part of the authority NLC, not Doncaster UDP as stated in the design access statement. While there may be some similarity in planning policy the policies quoted do not relate to NLC and therefore we will respond using only NLC local plan and the NPPF

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and NPPF. The site access is close to the bend in the road and the increase in vehicle movement may affect the road safety due to the limited visual distance.

It is our view that because the applicant has used Doncaster UDP local plan, the housing density is not appropriate to the village of Westwoodside and will impact on the character of the rural village

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NPPF 53 Local planning authorities should consider the case for setting out policies to resist inappropriate development of residential gardens, for example where development would cause harm to the local area.

We are concerned both NPPF and The Local Plan are being driven by pressure from central government at the expense of rural villages, as we can see no clear and convincing evidence for this development

**Proposed: Cllr Carlile, seconded: Cllr Condliff. 9 for with 1 abstention.**

Mr Farmer had provided the Parish Council with a drawing of his proposed warehouse located on Doncaster Road. Clerk to thank Mr Farmer for providing this information and advice that at this point the Parish Council cannot re-visit the application formally and that he needs to submit this amendment in a revised planning application so the Parish Council can discuss and resolve on it. Clerk to also state it would be useful to have a pictorial of the street scene with the warehouse in place.

Cllr Carlile added that residents should attend the Parish Council meetings as some applicants are critical of the Parish Council who don't want to be negative but can only make decisions on what is presented with an application.

b. To receive an update on planning issues.

**Willow Fields/Walkabout Farm** – due to the timescales that this had been on the agenda Cllr Allcock had sought more action and details on this. NLC Enforcement have responded as detailed below: -

“I appreciate the delay and lack of progress is a concern to the Parish Council and local resident, and it is frustrating for ourselves also; but I hope you will appreciate not only the complexity of this case due to the passage of time (even prior to my involvement) but also the number of new complaints alleging breaches of planning controls elsewhere in the Authorities area that continue to be received and need to be investigated. Whilst it is no excuse, this year alone we have experienced a 20% increase in allegations on the previous year. I can only apologise for the delay.

In respect of this case, we did seek to 'stop the clock' by issuing enforcement notices several years ago. Now that our legal colleagues have joined us in these offices and I will be speaking to them asap to determine whether a prosecution can proceed with the evidence that I have put forward in respect of the Enforcement Notice served.

In respect of the fresher allegations regarding the alterations to the cabin, storage of caravans etc, I have arranged with another officer to undertake a joint visit to the site next week to establish what is happening on the site.

Whilst I may not be able to give you any clearer indication of a resolution to this matter for this meeting, I am confident that by your next meeting we will have clearer paths to follow and be able to update you in more detail.”

**Sheppard’s Place & Akeferry Road/Langholme Lane – Advertisement boards** – Sheppard’s Place application on the agenda. Langholme Lane – the trailer and signage have been removed from the field but there is still a sign located on the gate. Clerk to ask that the tenant makes arrangements for the sign to be removed as this is potentially a breach of the tenancy agreement.

**Sheppard’s Place – caravan** – the caravan is still located on site and there is also a portacabin. Clerk to inform NLC Enforcement.

**Haxey Carr Study Centre** – to be discussed agenda item 1903/22.

**Haxey Carr Barn** – barn still in situ while the appeal is decided.

#### Improvement / Projects

#### 1903/08 To determine actions required to be taken at the Westwoodside Pond.

Cllr Hunt-Siwy stated she is waiting for 3 quotes to carry out repairs, removing the silt, lining the pond and providing some form of framework for the pump.

The area needs to be kept tidy and there is some structural damage under the road. Westwoodside Pond Lights Committee are being kept informed.

Cllr Knowles has spoken with NLC Andrea Brocklebank with regard to the tree in the centre of the pond. Andrea Brocklebank was not able to get to the tree but it was thought that damage was being done to the tree by the lights which are cutting into the tree. Cllr Booth stated that the Committee had said they had had someone to look at the tree and it was safe and healthy.

Clerk to arrange for a boat to be able to take NLC Andrea Brocklebank over to the tree to confirm her thoughts and once this had been received Clerk to ask the Committee for a copy of the report on the tree.

Cllr Whitehead stated he thought the rats had gone. Clerk had asked a local pest controller to take a look and will see what his thoughts were.

**1903/09** To receive an update on the proposed competition for the parish schools to participate in the creation of an anti-dog fouling poster determining actions required.

Cllr Booth stated that both schools were interested in taking part in this initiative. Item to be placed onto the May agenda for confirmation of prizes and requirements.

**1903/10** To consider the information received to update the Parish Directory determining actions required.

Information had been received from Cllrs Condliff and Lindley. Clerk to resend the directory and any amendments to be provided by 12<sup>th</sup> April. Once the directory has been updated a copy will be placed onto the website.

#### **Highways / Neighbourhood Services / North Lincolnshire Council items**

**1903/11** To receive an update from NLC about the management of the Public Open Space on the junction of Graizelound Field Road and Low Street determining any further actions required.

No update had been received prior to the meeting. The Clerk had asked who was determining this so she could contact direct.

**Post Meeting:** confirmation from NLC Legal that nothing had been received from the Developer and further discussion would take place with NLC Neighbourhood Services to determine actions.

**1903/12** To receive any update about the traffic issues on Church Street and High Street in Haxey including the concerns raised by the 399 bus through Church Street, Haxey determining actions required.

A meeting has been arranged between NLC Highways and the Doctors Surgery. Once this has taken place then NLC Highways will provide a proposal for Church Street.

**1903/13** To consider the acceptance of the Grass Verge pilot scheme and the Parish Path Ground Maintenance project from NLC.

**Resolved** – acceptance for the pilot scheme and project to be undertaken by the Parish Council.

**1903/14** To consider the quotes received for the grass verge/parish path ground maintenance.

The Council had been provided with a summary of the quotes received prior to the meeting.

**Resolved** – Darren Roberts was selected as the preferred contractor to undertake the cutting of the parish paths on a 3-year contract. The selection was based on the past 3 years work which has been done to a high standard. **Proposed: Cllr Henwood, seconded: Cllr Fiddler. All in favour.**

**Resolved** – NS Groundcare was selected as the preferred contractor to undertake the cutting of the grass verges on a 3-year contract. The selection was based on his previous work within the parish which has been done to a high standard. **Proposed: Cllr Henwood, seconded: Cllr Hunt-Siwy. All in favour.**

**1903/15** To be notified of the comments with regard to the overgrown ivy on Doctor's Trod leaving Church Street determining actions required.

Cllr Harris declared a personal interest. A resident after seeing in the Arrow the advertisement of the Parish Path tender has written to the Clerk to state that this footpath is overgrown with ivy and could

it be cut back as it makes the path very narrow. Concerns were also raised about the safety of the brick wall which was leaning into the parish path.

Clerk to ask the contractor to cut back the ivy on the first cut and Cllr Harris to provide the details of the resident who owns the wall with regard to its safety.

**1903/16** To receive an update on the works being carried out on FP89 determining any further actions required.

NLC Dave Sanderson looking into who owns the land with regard to the obstructing equipment being placed on to the footpath. Item deferred to the next meeting.

**1903/17** To consider the installation of additional dog bins in the parish.

**Resolved** – Clerk to ask NLC to replace the bins on Epworth Road, Langholme Lane and Haxey Lane as the bases have rusted and fallen out.

**Resolved** – Clerk to order a new bin for Thinholme Lane, after consultation with Cllr Cooke on the best location away from properties. Clerk to also order a bin for East Lound, Cllr Condliff to confirm the location and that residents are happy with the selected location.

**Proposed: Cllr Henwood, seconded: Cllr Condliff. All in favour.**

### **Reports / Updates**

**1903/18** To receive a report from the Ward Councillor on activities within North Lincolnshire Council.

Cllr Allcock stated that with regard to the TRO for Newbigg, NLC have received 2 written objections from residents. The TRO will have to go to Cabinet for a decision but in the meantime the Clerk will write to NLC Ian Jickells to confirm that the Parish Council are happy for the TRO to be implemented as soon as possible. **Proposed: Cllr Fiddler, seconded: Cllr Carlile. All in favour.**

Cllr Allcock also informed the meeting that NLC have now all moved to the new offices at Church Square House.

**1903/19** To receive a report from the Westwoodside Playing Field Management Committee.

The WPPFA meeting was held on 22/03 and the minutes from the meeting had been circulated.

Some funding has been received to replace the MUGA lights with LED.

There are currently some issues with some of the cameras which are being investigated.

**1903/20** To receive an update report on hydro-carbon activities in the area.

Cllr Fiddler informed the meeting that the drilling is down to 3,500m and the sensors are to the bottom monitoring the properties seeping from the shale. On the IGas website is a video of the fracking process. Frack Free have been in contact with the Clerk about making a further presentation and they will approach the Council after the Elections.

**1903/21** To receive an update on the ACV Tribunal process determining any further actions required.

The Parish Council are up to date with all actions.

**1903/22** To receive an update from the LWP site meeting on the reported installation of a mobile caravan on parish land determining actions required.

The LWP invited NLC Enforcement Officer who attended and between the group it identified that the caravan was indeed on parish land. Subsequent to the meeting NLC took an action to contact the tenant advising him of the meeting and the outcome asking that the caravan and base was moved to within the property's curtilage.

The Agent has now written to the Parish Council stating that the tenant is minded to move the caravan into the property's curtilage asking that the Parish Council confirm they are happy with this relocation solution. Prior to any confirmation by the Parish Council, the Clerk to establish that the base will be removed and for the agent to request the tenant commits to a date of both the removal

of the base, the relocation of the caravan and the site making good, prior to a final inspection by the Parish Council.

**Proposed: Cllr Henwood, seconded: Cllr Hunt-Siwy. All in favour.**

**1903/26** To consider the placement of a bench of FP108 and the placement of a bench at the Westwoodside Pond, determining actions required.

It was not known who owned the land on FP108 that the proposed bench would be sited on therefore, Cllr Fiddler agreed to approach the resident for him to obtain written permission to site the bench and to provide details of what type of bench is required with a proposed donation towards the bench. Further discussion for the next meeting.

Cllrs Booth & Smedley had met with the late Mrs & Mr Neill's daughter with regard to the siting of a memorial bench near to Westwoodside Pond. A site was proposed and the Clerk to arrange a site meeting with NLC and Cllr Booth for approval to site the bench. The bench would be near to the home of Mr & Mrs Neill and would also serve the nearby bus stop.

Mrs Margaret Neill and her sister Julie would purchase the bench and the cost to install. Clerk to arrange once permission had been granted from NLC.

**1903/27** To be notified of the NLC Great British Spring Clean 22<sup>nd</sup> March-23<sup>rd</sup> April determining actions required.

The event had been widely advertised.

**1903/28** To consider the erection of a memorial/adding of names to Haxey Memorial for fallen airmen over Haxey in 1945.

Cllr Condliff stated she had recently been involved with the typing up of the information with regard to the fallen airmen and will send to the Clerk for circulation. Cllr Carlile stated that there was a website dedicated to the airmen that had fallen within the parish. Addition of names to the Parish War Memorial was restricted to Haxey Parish Residents. After the elections a meeting will be arranged with a small group of Cllrs to move any appropriate memorial activity forward.
